Getting started

Setup takes less than fifteen minutes.

Step 1: Researcher profile

- Add your discipline, sub fields, and research questions.
- Include career stage, affiliation, and preferred geographies.

- Upload a short bio or CV summary to sharpen matching.

Step 2: Activate your agent

- Select the individual researcher plan.
- Your agent begins scanning within hours of activation.
- Adjust filters at any time as your interests evolve.

Step 3: Manage opportunities

- Save promising calls and set personal deadlines.
- Track applications from draft to submission.
- Export a monthly summary for your supervisor or mentor.

Best practices

- Refine your profile after the first two weeks of use.
- Set aside a fixed weekly slot to review matched opportunities.
- Keep a lightweight log of applications, outcomes, and reviewer feedback.
- Use partnership matches to co author and strengthen proposals.
